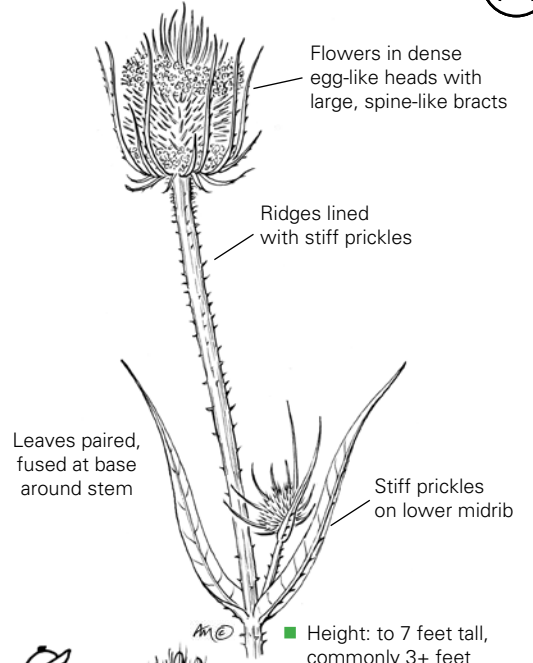




D.Tomaso

Also Known As	Common teasel, wild teasel
Origin	Nonnative, invasive
Habitat	Irrigation ditches, canals, wetlands, riparian areas, disturbed sites
Life Cycle	Tap-rooted biennial
Flowering Time	July to fall
Relative Abundance	Infrequent
Management	Dig or hand-pull, removing as much root as possible; herbicides are available
Noxious Weed List	Nevada-NO; California-NO



- Height: to 7 feet tall, commonly 3+ feet
- Stems: branched, rough and spiny
- Leaves: conspicuously veined; stem leaves lanceolate and up to 10 inches long
- Growth form: erect
- Flower color: lavender to purple, rarely white
